## **MINUTES OF THE DECEMBER 16, 2019 REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING**

Mayor-Council Member Fallot declared the minutes of the December 16, 2019 Regular Council meeting approved as presented.

### **PERSONS APPEARING BEFORE COUNCIL**

Mike Snyder, Ron Derry, and Mike Carden reported to Council regarding information for a new Civil War Memorial and distributed an information sheet. Mr. Snyder reported that the Louisville Nimishillen Historical Society would like to purchase and erect a memorial to the 28 area men who perished in the Civil War. Mr. Derry stated that the Louisville Nimishillen Historical Society suggested the excess funding from the Korean/Vietnam memorial may be best suited in erecting a Civil War Memorial as well as used for maintenance of the Korean/Vietnam Memorial. Mr. Carden reported that he has spent years researching who and where the men were from that died in the Civil War for a plaque as the Civil War Memorial. Mr. Carden reported that he is in the process of getting 2 quotes for a bronze plaque that is 38 inches by 40 inches. Mr. Carden also reported that the location is to-be-determined by the committee but suggests erecting it behind the Dough Boy statue. Mr. Carden also questioned if the Constitution Town plaque could be relocated to behind the other side of the Dough Boy statue. Mr. Derry asked for permission to erect the memorial on City property.

COUNCIL MEMBER STREET MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER ALJANCIC, and the motion carried granting permission for the Civil War Memorial Project to be located on City property. The vote: All yea.

### **BOARD OF CONTROL**

COUNCIL MEMBER STREET MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER SLACKFORD, and the motion carried approving the capital purchases costing \$10,000 or more. The vote: All yea.

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COUNCIL MEMBER STREET MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER ALJANCIC, and the motion carried for the second reading of Ordinance No. 19-56. The vote: All yea. Mayor-Council Member Falot declared Ordinance No. 19-56 duly passed and enacted.

**NEW BUSINESS**

COUNCIL MEMBER STREET MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER SLACKFORD, and the motion carried to not request a hearing for a transfer of liquor license to Enjoys Drive Thru LLC DBA Enjoys Drive Thru, 306 Enterprise Cir. Louisville, OH 44641 from Enjoys Inc DBA Enjoys Drive Thru, 306 Enterprise Cir. Louisville, OH 44641. The vote: All yea.

COUNCIL MEMBER STREET MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER ALJANCIC, and the motion carried to appoint John Philippi to an unexpired term (4 years) to the Planning Commission and an unexpired term (1 year) to Board of Zoning Appeals. The vote: All yea.

COUNCIL MEMBER STREET MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER SLACKFORD, and the motion carried for the Mayor nominations, Demond Germany and Tom McAlister to the Tax Incentive Review Commission. The vote: All yea.

City Manager Larry Collins reported that the ice skating rink re-opened today, and the warmer weather has made it difficult. Mr. Collins reminded Council that a Charter Review Committee needs to be formed with 5 or 7 community leaders for appointment. A City Service Survey is on the City's Facebook page, please encourage people to take it.

Director of Planning & Development Vince Marion reported that the monthly/year end reports were distributed. The number of houses built in 2018 and 2019 equal the prior 7 years of new houses. Filed the Municipal Road Fund application last week when ODOT is ready to pave Route 44.

Fire Chief Rod Bordner reported that the monthly report was distributed and there was an increase of 61 calls from last year for a total of 1,780 call for 2019.

Police Chief Andy Turowski reported that the monthly and annual reports are not available at this time. Adam DeWalt, who was the shooter on Opal Street in July of 2019 was convicted on all accounts.

Larry Collins reported that Andy Turowski was promoted to Assistant City Manager in charge of Public Safety over police, fire and service.

Service Director Dan Millsap had nothing to report.

Mayor-Council Member Falot reported that the 2020 census information will be coming out April 1<sup>st</sup> and it is important to give an accurate account for everyone in the household. The count is used for funding purposes through both the federal and the state.

The meeting was adjourned.
