COUNCIL MEMBER GUILLEY MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER STREET, and the motion carried for the second reading of Ordinance No. 19-27. The vote: All yea. Mayor-Council Member Fallot declared Ordinance No. 19-27 duly passed and enacted.

### **AMENDED ORDINANCE NO. 19-28** – BEING AN AMENDED ORDINANCE MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR CURRENT EXPENDITURES OF THE CITY OF LOUISVILLE, STARK COUNTY, STATE OF OHIO, FOR THE YEAR BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 2019

COUNCIL MEMBER GUILLEY MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER ALJANCIC , and the motion carried to suspend the rules to allow for the emergency adoption of Amended Ordinance No. 19-28. *The emergency measure is necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, welfare, and safety and especially for the reason of immediate ratification necessary to encumber the funds and pay contracts.* The vote: All yea

COUNCIL MEMBER GUILLEY MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER FLORY, and the motion carried for the second reading of Amended Ordinance No. 19-28 by emergency: The vote: All

yea. Mayor-Council Member Fallot declared Amended Ordinance No. 19-28 duly passed and enacted.

## **NEW BUSINESS**

City Manager Collins informed Council Members that the liquor license type being requested by West Main Drive Thru LLC (Independent Pathways property) is not currently available in the City of Louisville. Adjoining communities are permitted, with permission, to transfer available liquor licenses if desired. Director Marion informed Council Members that the property owner had received prior site plan approval for a drive-thru at this location.

COUNCIL MEMBER STREET MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER FLORY, and the motion carried approving the Economic Development (TRES) Transfer Form allowing the transfer of location of liquor permit from Nimishillen Township to the City of Louisville for the perspective permit holder, West Main Drive Thru LLC, 1616 West Main Street. The vote: Flory: yea, Guiley: abstained, Street: yea, Aljancic: yea, Fallot yea.

Fire Chief Bordner reported an EMS grant was received for \$3,300 and will be used for supplies. A donation of \$1,000 was received from the American Legion.

Planning & Development Director Marion provided council members with the June 2019 staff report. The demolition of 733 N Chapel St is scheduled for July 16, 2019. Covington Ridge Phase 3 development plans have been conditionally approved by Planning Commission.

Police Chief Turowski reported there will be traffic awareness signs being located in speed concern areas in the City. The school resource officers will be attending a national convention presentation in Las Vegas. A donation of \$1,000 was received from the American Legion.

Service Director Millsap reported a donation of \$1,000 from the American Legion. City workers have completed their work in the Bauman Ct alley. Volunteer members with the STORM group, from Christ United Methodist Church, had been working on improvements at Metzger Park. The sewer line will be being installed tomorrow for the Aljancic Park Splash Pad. It was discussed that a pothole machine may be available through worker's comp funds/grant.

Mayor-Council Member Fallot reported resident's interest in a dog run in Louisville. Mayor-Council Member Fallot contacted Plain Township for more information. Plain Township reported their dog park to be a huge success. Mayor-Council Member Fallot also informed members that the St. Louis festival is this weekend. Lastly, the Constitution Queen & court will be appearing in a community parade in downtown Canton and then the Hall of Fame grand parade on August 2nd.

Council Member Aljancic informed members that the ArtsinStark 20/20 Vision group is in the planning stages for an Octoberfest/Halloween festival October 26<sup>th</sup> from 5pm-10pm in downtown Louisville. It is anticipated that the brewery and umbrella alley will be open for this event. Member Aljancic discussed displaying veteran banners on downtown flag poles when poles are not in use by the school district. There will be follow up with Louisville Rotary as they had also inquired about obtaining veteran banners.
